Advent Service Theme: "His Gospel is Peace"

Pastor Matt Popovits, author of this year's Advent series- "His Gospel is Peace" writes: To be human is to understand what it means to fear. The smallest child is afraid when the lights turn off at night. The most famous rock star is driven by fear of rejection from their adoring fans. Fear keeps us from the Thanksgiving dinner table (or perhaps fuels the shouting match after the pumpkin pie is served). Fear causes us to stockpile our houses with toilet paper and water bottles "just in case." Fear elevates and prolongs our anxiety or our shame as we choose to avoid addressing our mistakes- and the mistakes of others- out of concern that we'll only make things worse." The season of Advent helps us long for a different reality: one ruled by peace rather than fear. Christ's birth and the promise of His second coming

The season of Advent helps us long for a different reality: one ruled by peace rather than fear. Christ's birth and the promise of His second coming mean peace is breaking through. Jesus was born into our tribulation, despair, and fear not just to comfort us but to bring an end to whatever terrifies us most.

This is why the psalmist says, "We will not fear, though the earth gives way."

It's why one of Jesus' common refrains is "Fear not."

It's why Paul proclaims that the peace of God guards and rules over the hearts of His people.

The Prince of Peace comes to live for us, die for us, and rise for us. In doing so, He overcomes death itself, cleanses us of our sins, defeats the evil one, and makes us righteous. Through faith in our Savior, born Immanuel, we cannot be rejected, we have nothing to be ashamed of, and we have the promise of life everlasting. In Christ alone, fear is exchanged for peace.

Our Wednesday Advent services this year (1 pm and 7 pm) will focus on several places in Scripture where God addresses our fears and proclaims His peace. Despite your worries, anxieties, and very real suffering, we have a God who stands resolute to give us His "peace which surpasses all understanding" (Phil. 4:7).



Advent is a season of waiting, a time to prepare our hearts and lives for the coming of Jesus. Yet, in a world that values instant gratification, waiting can feel like an inconvenience. We rush through our days, our minds filled with tasks and deadlines, often forgetting to pause and reflect on the deeper meaning of the season. But Advent invites us to slow down and embrace the wait, reminding us that the most precious gifts often come only after a period of expectation.

The word "advent" comes from the Latin adventus, meaning "coming" or "arrival." Advent is a time to anticipate the arrival of Christ's birth at Christmas, as well as His promised return. It's a season filled with anticipation, but unlike the frenzy that often accompanies holiday preparations, Advent calls us into a peaceful waiting that is filled with hope.

1. Waiting with Hope

In Psalm 130, the psalmist speaks of waiting with a hopeful heart: "I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in His Word I put my hope." Advent encourages us to wait, not out of resignation, but with anticipation for what God is preparing. This hope is not merely wishful thinking. It is a steadfast assurance in God's promises. As we light each candle on the Advent wreath, we are reminded of God's faithfulness throughout history. Just as Israel waited for the Messiah, we too wait, but with a hopeful heart, knowing that Christ has already come and is present with us.

Hope is not always easy. There are times when waiting feels like wandering through darkness, uncertain if the dawn will ever break. But Advent teaches us that light does come, and that Jesus—the Light of the World—will illuminate even the darkest places in our lives. Our waiting, then, becomes an act of faith, a way of leaning into God's promises with confidence.

2. Preparing Our Hearts

Advent also invites us to prepare. When we wait with a purpose, our waiting becomes meaningful. This season, instead of filling our time with busyness, we can choose to fill it with prayer, reflection, and acts of kindness. Just as we clean and decorate our homes for Christmas, we can also make room in our hearts for Jesus.

John the Baptist called people to "prepare the way of the Lord." We, too, are called to remove anything that stands in the way of our relationship with God. Maybe it's a spirit of bitterness or unforgiveness. Perhaps it's the distraction of materialism or an anxious heart that needs peace. Whatever it may be, Advent is a time to reflect and surrender these burdens to God. As we prepare our hearts, we create space for the joy and love of Christ to dwell within us.

3. Embracing the Joy of Anticipation

There's a unique joy in anticipation, a quiet thrill that comes with looking forward to something special. Think about a child waiting for Christmas morning, the sense of wonder and joy bubbling up in expectation. Advent invites us to rediscover this childlike wonder as we await the birth of Jesus.

This joy does not erase our challenges; instead, it gives us a reason to endure them with hope. In the waiting, God shapes and molds us, preparing us for the blessings He has in store. We learn patience, resilience, and gratitude, and we begin to see life with fresh eyes. The waiting becomes a gift, a time when God can work within us, drawing us closer to His heart.

Reflection Questions:

- What are you waiting for in this season of Advent? Is there a hope, dream, or promise you're holding onto?
- How can you use this time of waiting to deepen your relationship with God?
- Are there any areas in your life that need preparation? What might you need to let go of or change to make room for Christ?

Advent is a time to remember that God works in the waiting. As we light the candles each week and count down the days, let us wait with hopeful expectation, prepare our hearts for His arrival, and embrace the joy of anticipation. May this season of waiting draw us closer to the One who is the true gift of Christmas.

Let's Pray.

Lord Jesus, we thank You for the gift of Advent, for the reminder to pause and wait with hopeful hearts. As we prepare to celebrate Your birth, may we find joy in the waiting, peace in the anticipation, and strength in Your promises. Help us to trust in Your timing and to welcome You with open hearts. Amen.
