

The Nunc Dimittis: Simeon's Song



I'm a bit embarrassed to admit it. I was just a kid. When a certain song played toward the end of the church service, I got excited about packing up my things to go home. It was the *Nunc Dimittis*- the post-communion canticle. "Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace according to Thy Word..." The pastor instructed everyone to stand to sing. This was my

cue that church was almost over and soon I could depart in peace and put on some comfortable clothes.

Many years later I learned what this song really means. It means much more than, "Oh boy! I get to go home now!" It comes from Luke 2:29-32. Joseph and Mary brought their 40-day old son to the Jerusalem temple to be presented to the Lord. A man in the temple named Simeon walked up to the family, took the baby Jesus into his arms, and said, "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for the glory to your people Israel (ESV)." It had been revealed to Simeon that he would not die until he had seen the Lord's Christ. Day after day, he prayed in the temple, waiting and watching. Finally, Simeon's great moment had come! He got to see with his eyes and hold in his arms his salvation. He could now declare his readiness to die in peace and go to his heavenly home.

Perhaps you now understand why we sing this Song of Simeon right after the celebration of Holy Communion. At this sacred meal we receive the very body and blood of Christ in, with, and under the bread and wine. Into our hands and mouths, are given the same Lord who was held in Simeon's arms, nailed to a cross for our sins, and raised back to life from the dead. By partaking of this Sacrament, we are forgiven of our sins, united with our Savior, and strengthened to live a Christian life. Like Simeon, we have seen our salvation and can declare with faith, "Lord, you may dismiss me from this vale of tears according to your word. I'm ready for heaven."

Nunc Dimittis is Latin for "Now let us depart," or "Now dismiss." It's still one of my favorite parts of the liturgy. But not because it's my cue to go home and kick my feet up. Simeon's Song reminds me that I have just tasted and seen that the Lord is good (Psalm 34:8). Will it be the last time I eat this Supper before I die? Only the Lord knows. But having seen and tasted my salvation, I am well-prepared and at peace with God. Confident in the Lord's mercy, we are ready to go to our heavenly home.
