The Benefits of Memorizing Scripture

It's "Back to School" time! Once again, students have unpacked their backpacks, met their new teachers, and started doing homework. In our confirmation program at Park View Lutheran, our 5th-8th graders are also expected to do "homework." We encourage them to read an assigned portion of the Bible before bed each night and spend a little bit of time memorizing a verse or two for each week.

The word "memorize" might sound a bit scary. It was for me as I grew up attending a Lutheran parochial school. Memorizing Bible verses and parts of Luther's Small Catechism was a challenge. It did not come easy for me, and I often grumbled about it. But over the years, I have seen the benefits. Here are five benefits of memorizing Scripture; what I prefer to call "Learning by Heart."

1. A Weapon in Times of Spiritual Battle

We are tempted to sin daily. Our enemy, the devil, tries hard to lead us away from Christ and into dark unbelief. Therefore, God has equipped us with the "Sword of the Spirit," the Word of God (Eph. 6:17). When we learn God's Spirit-filled Word by heart, we are readying ourselves for battle. This is exactly what our Lord Jesus used when He was tempted by Satan in the wilderness (Matt. 4:1-9). If it's good enough for Jesus it's good enough for us!

2. Comfort in Times of Crisis

We all have our moments of spiritual crisis. When a family member or friend dies unexpectedly, for example, our minds can be flooded with many thoughts and questions. A Bible verse like Philippians 1:21, "For me, to live is Christ and to die is gain," hidden in our heart, keeps us at peace. I have met many elderly people who cannot read anymore, but they find comfort in the words of Scripture and old hymns that have been imprinted in their memory.

3. A Fountain for Prayer

When our prayers seem stale and stagnant, we have a fountain of rich words to draw from in Scripture. The many prayers we find in the Psalms are especially good for committing to memory. I can attest from experience that when I pray in public, I am much more confident and free to speak when I have recently spent some time in the Word.

4. Spiritual Counsel and Encouragement for Others

From time to time Christians have the opportunity to offer spiritual counsel and encouragement to others. A Bible verse that you have taken the time to learn by heart may be just what that person needs to hear. Rather than scramble for that verse in your Bible index/concordance, how much more freeing it is to recite it from the heart! Proverbs 25:11 says, "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in a setting of silver."

5. Sharing the Gospel with Unbelievers

We may not always have a Bible at hand when we have the precious opportunity to share the good news of Jesus with an unbelieving friend. Therefore, Peter tells us, "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this gentleness and respect (1 Peter 3:15)."

Living Out the Great Commission in Daily Life

In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus commands us to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." This Great Commission is not just a call for pastors, DCE/O interns, missionaries, or church leaders—it's a charge for each of us as followers of Christ. But how do we live out this commission in our everyday lives? The answer is simpler than we might think. Living out the Great Commission doesn't always require grand gestures or going to distant lands—It begins with our everyday interactions, our attitudes, and the way we love and serve those around us.

- 1. Start with Prayer The first step in living out the Great Commission is prayer. Begin each day by asking God to open your eyes to the opportunities around you. Pray for the people you encounter, that God would soften their hearts and open doors for meaningful conversations. Prayer aligns our hearts with God's mission and prepares us to see the world through His eyes.
- **2. Build Relationships** Jesus' ministry was built on relationships. He spent time with people, listened to their stories, and met them where they were. We can do the same by taking time to build genuine relationships with our neighbors, co-workers, and others in our community. Invite a colleague for coffee, check in on a neighbor, or join a local community group. Through these relationships, we have opportunities to share our faith naturally and lovingly.
- **3.** Be a Light in Your Actions Actions often speak louder than words. As Christians, we are called to reflect Christ in all that we do. This means showing kindness, patience, and love, even in challenging situations. Whether it's offering a helping hand, speaking words of encouragement, or simply being a listening ear, our actions can demonstrate the love of Christ to those around us.
- **4. Share Your Story** You don't need to have all the answers to share your faith. Your personal story of how God has worked in your life is powerful. When appropriate, share how your faith has guided you through difficult times, brought you peace, or given you hope. People are often more open to hearing about your personal experiences than a theological argument.
- **5. Extend an Invitation** Sometimes the simplest way to live out the Great Commission is to invite someone to church, a Bible study, or a church event. This invitation could be the first step in someone's journey to faith. Don't underestimate the power of a personal invitation.
- **6. Serve with Compassion** Look for ways to serve others, whether through your church's outreach programs, local charities, or simply by helping those in need around you. When we serve with compassion, we embody the love of Christ and open the door for others to experience His grace.
- **7. Live with Integrity** Our integrity in daily life—being honest, reliable, and ethical—can be a powerful witness. When people see that our faith influences how we live, they may become curious about the source of our strength and peace.
- **8. Stay Grounded in Scripture** Finally, staying grounded in God's Word equips us to live out the Great Commission. Regularly reading and meditating on Scripture strengthens our faith and provides us with the wisdom and discernment needed to share God's love effectively. The Great Commission is not an overwhelming task reserved for a select few; it's an invitation for all of us to participate in God's mission. By starting with small, intentional actions in our daily lives, we can make a significant impact for God's Kingdom. As we pray, build relationships, serve, and share our stories, we can help others experience the transforming love of Christ.
