

# The Resurrection of the Body

Christians believe that Jesus physically rose from the dead. This is what we celebrate on Easter Sunday. Our Lord's body was crucified and buried on a Friday. His body rested in the grave on Saturday. He then physically rose early on Sunday morning and made many resurrection appearances. The women at the tomb touched His feet (Matt. 28:9). Thomas saw the wounds in His hands and side (John 20:27). The disciples even watched the resurrected Jesus eat some fish



(Luke 24:43). When we talk about Jesus' resurrection, we understand this to be a *bodily* resurrection, not just a spiritual rising from death.

Many people today have no problem with the bodily resurrection of Jesus, but they may be shocked to hear that their own bodies will someday rise. Many think that when we die our spirits go to heaven, and that's the end of the story. To them, "resurrection" for the human is just a spiritual phenomenon. Some may even conclude, "What we do with the bodily remains of our loved one doesn't matter because the real person is now with Jesus."

Yet, the Bible consistently teaches that God still has plans for the bones and ashes that are now buried in the earth. He plans to raise them up and reunite them with their spirits (also called "souls"). Even believers in the Old Testament trusted in this promise. Job 19:25-26 says, "For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last He will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God." Isaiah 26:19 says, "Your dead shall live; their bodies shall rise. You who dwell in the dust, awake and sing for joy! For your dew is a dew of light, and the earth will give birth to the dead." Daniel 12:2 says, "Multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake; some to everlasting life, others to shame and everlasting contempt."

The New Testament says even more about the resurrection. The best treatment of this subject is in 1 Corinthians 15:35-58. Paul contrasts the weak and corruptible bodies we have now to the glorious bodies that we will receive at Christ's second coming. The perishable body will put on the imperishable, and the mortal will put on immortality. All of this will happen in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. The dead will be raised, and we shall all be changed. And not only will our lowly bodies be transformed to be like Jesus' glorious body (Philippians 3:21). The Bible tells us that all of creation will be renewed (Romans 8:18-22). The book of Revelation calls it "a new heaven and a new earth."

God has not destined us to be disembodied spirits for all eternity. Nor does He plan to turn us into angels who will strum harps forever in the clouds. He plans to fully restore our humanity, wholly enlivened by the Holy Spirit. In Christ, God became man so that by His death and resurrection, we would be His new creation. As we listen to His Word and receive the Supper of His body and blood, we are strengthened and preserved in body and soul. This is why we confess in the Nicene Creed, "I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." Points of Interest



# <u>Spring Cleaning for the Soul</u>

As the days grow longer and the temperatures rise (though not as quickly as we hope), many of us find ourselves tackling the annual tradition of spring cleaning. We open the windows, clear out the clutter, and refresh our homes after the long winter months. There's something deeply satisfying about restoring order and creating.



But what if we took the same approach with our spiritual lives? Just as dust and clutter build up in our homes, so can distractions, worries, and sinful habits accumulate in our hearts. Spring is the perfect time to do some spiritual housecleaning and make room for renewal in our walk with Christ.

In Psalm 51:10, David prays, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." This verse reminds us that we can bring our mess—our sins, burdens, and distractions—to God, and He will cleanse and renew us.

Here are a few ways we can do some spiritual spring cleaning:

Declutter Your Mind with Prayer

- Just as we sort through closets, we can take time to examine our thoughts and attitudes. Are we holding on to negativity, fear, or resentment? Through prayer, we can give these burdens to God and allow His peace to replace them (Philippians 4:6-7).
- Dust Off Your Bible
  - Just like neglected shelves collect dust, our faith can grow stagnant without regular time in God's Word. Making a habit of daily Scripture reading can refresh our souls and keep us focused on God's truth.

Clean Up Relationships

Spring cleaning often involves getting rid of things that no longer serve a purpose. In our spiritual lives, this might mean letting go of grudges, forgiving past hurts, or mending broken relationships (Colossians 3:13).

Refresh Your Faith through Worship and Fellowship

A clean and organized home feels inviting, just as a heart refreshed in Christ is more open to worship and community. Attending church, joining a Bible study, or finding ways to serve can reignite our faith.

This spring, as you sweep the floors and clear out the clutter, take a moment to ask: What needs cleaning in my heart? May this season be a time of renewal, drawing us closer to the God who makes all things new (2 Corinthians 5:17).
