A Few Tips for Daily Prayer

This month in confirmation class our 7th and 8th graders are learning about the Lord's Prayer. In all the years I've been teaching this prayer to my students, I still feel like I haven't mastered it. I go back to the Bible each year and find myself discovering new things about this worthy prayer that Jesus taught to His disciples. It's short, but dense! There is given potitions, and a conclusion. It takes less than 30 seconds.

an introduction, seven petitions, and a conclusion. It takes less than 30 seconds to say, and yet it covers a wide range of important concerns: 1. God's name, 2. God's kingdom, 3. God will, 4. Our daily bread, 5. Our forgiveness from God, and for others, 6. Our temptations, and 7. the constant threat of evil around us.

Sadly, as important as this prayer is, my mind tends to wander off when I say it. The words roll off my tongue faster than my mind can follow. Perhaps you have this problem, too. It's hard to concentrate sometimes. There are so many distractions that clutter our brains. Perhaps, it would be helpful to slow down and just focus on one petition a day. Consider following this weekly schedule.

Jesus also taught us to pray for one another. We call this "intercessory prayer." Again, it can be a struggle to set aside time to pray. How many times have we told someone that we will pray for him or her, but forget to do it? My wife and I have gotten into the habit lately of keeping a list of names of people who need prayer (family, church members, friends, government leaders, etc.). We keep it on the dinner table to remind ourselves to pray each night. We divide the list into two and take turns praying for each person.

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These are just a couple of simple tips for daily prayer.
