Why the Nicene Creed Still Matters



In A.D. 325, the Roman Emperor Constantine called church leaders from across the empire to gather in the city of Nicaea (modern-day Turkey). Christianity had just emerged from brutal persecution under earlier emperors, and now, as the faith grew rapidly, so did theological disputes—especially one sparked by a presbyter named

Arius. He claimed that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, was not truly divine, but a created being. This challenged the heart of the Christian faith.

To defend the truth handed down from the apostles, over 300 bishops from Africa, Asia, and Europe met in Nicaea to confess what Scripture teaches: that Jesus is not a mere creature but of the same essence as the Father—fully God and fully man. From their work came the Nicene Creed, a bold and beautiful summary of the Christian faith, crafted to unify the Church and preserve the truth of the Gospel.

But the Council didn't end the controversy. Arianism continued to trouble the Church for decades. One bishop in particular, Athanasius of Alexandria, became the leading defender of the Nicene faith. He was exiled five times for his unwavering stance that Jesus Christ is true God, equal to the Father. His perseverance helped preserve the biblical doctrine of the Trinity for generations to come.

Why do we still confess this creed today, 1,700 years later?

- To praise and acknowledge God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- To pledge our loyalty to Him in a world filled with false gods and shifting truths.
- To declare the faith once delivered to the saints, joining our voices with Christians throughout the centuries.

To find comfort—because we are not alone. We are part of a global and historic Church that stands firm on Christ the cornerstone.

When we confess the creeds, we are not simply reciting words—we are making a joyful and courageous stand in the truth. And that's worth doing every week.

Peace in the Midst of the Madness



Summer is often painted as a season of rest and relaxation—but if you've ever tried juggling family vacations, summer sports, wedding season, lawn care, graduation parties, and yes... planning for VBS, you know the truth: summer can be downright *chaotic*.

The days get longer, the to-do lists grow fuller, and the calendar quickly fills with activities—many of them good and joy-filled, but still demanding. Life doesn't slow down just because the calendar says it's June. In fact, sometimes it feels like it speeds up. And in the midst of that whirlwind, it's easy to feel overwhelmed, exhausted, or stretched thin.


