

"This Dust" - A Reflection for Ash Wednesday

March 5th, which is Ash Wednesday, marks the beginning of our Lenten journey-a season of reflection, repentance, and renewal. It's a time when we pause to remember our human frailty and our need for a Savior. The ashes placed on our foreheads remind us of the words from Genesis: "For dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19).

The song "This Dust" by Kip Fox beautifully captures the heart of this day:

"Lord have mercy on me, I am riddled with the world's disease Taking what I want, And turning it into my need I am flesh and blood, Never good enough You poured out Your love, To cover over this dust"

In these lyrics, we are reminded of our human condition- broken, selfish, and in need of God's mercy. Yet, the song also proclaims a powerful truth: God covers our dust, our sin, and our shame with His perfect love.

The song continues:

"Oh what senseless love, You would come to join with us Drink this cursed cup. Redeeming all that we've undone We are flesh and blood, Never good enough You poured out Your love, To cover over this dust"

Here, we see the heart of the Gospel: Jesus took on our dust-our humanity, sin, and suffering-to redeem and restore us. His sacrifice washes away our guilt and shame.

The final lines proclaim our Easter hope:

"Your mercy rains on all our shame "Death is all around us, We are not afraid And washes all the stain away" Written is the story, Empty is the grave"

Ash Wednesday invites us to enter the tension between death and life, sin, and grace.

We are dust-but we are dust redeemed.

Reflection Opportunity:

Read: Psalm 51:10-12 ("Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.")

Pray: Confess your sins and ask for God's mercy. Trust that His love covers even your deepest shame.

Listen: Play "This Dust" by Kip Fox. Let the lyrics guide you into a personal reflection on God's grace and your need for a Savior.

As we journey through Lent, may we remember that though we are dust, we are dust deeply loved and redeemed by our Savior.
