The mission of Park View Lutheran Church is to awaken unbelievers to faith in the Triune God, and teach believers to live as servants of the Risen Lord.

Twenty-Five Years of Change—and the Same Faithful God

This year marks my 25th year in pastoral ministry, and I've been thinking about how much the world has changed since I was ordained back on July 2, 2000. Life and ministry look very different now. Yet through it all, one thing hasn't changed: Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Technology

I got my first cell phone in 2002, mainly so I could be reached in case of an emergency, since my wife and I were expecting our first child. It was definitely *not* a smartphone! I had no idea how much those little devices would reshape our lives.

Now we carry the internet in our pockets. We text, take pictures, and scroll through news and social media all day long. We're more informed than ever, but also more distracted, anxious, and often more isolated. Everyone's looking down at their phones, and face-to-face connection is harder to find.

As a pastor, I see how hungry people are for *real* connection—for being seen, heard, and loved. That's something no app can provide. The ministry of presence, simply being with people in Christ's name, is more important now than ever.

Cultural Shifts

The culture around us has changed profoundly. Topics like sexuality, gender, race, and social justice have moved from the margins to the center of public conversation. When I was in seminary, it didn't occur to me that I would need to address these difficult issues someday from the pulpit.

The church, which once held a kind of default moral authority, is now just one voice among many. It saddens me to see how trust in clergy has diminished and how often life's major moments, such as marriage and death, now unfold without a pastor's presence or spiritual care. Family life looks different too. Cohabitation is more common, and birth rates have sharply declined. The busy schedules of weekly life don't always make space for worship.

All of this means ministry today feels less like tending a familiar flock and more like mission work in our own backyard. Yet it's also an opportunity. People are searching for truth and identity like never before—and we have a message that doesn't change with the times: every person is created, loved, and redeemed by God.

Crisis Fatigue

The last 25 years have brought enormous global challenges. I still remember where I was on September 11, 2001, and the anxious days that followed. Then

came Hurricane Katrina, the war in Iraq, the financial crisis, the COVID-19 pandemic, the war in Ukraine, and heart-breaking mass shootings close to home.

We are more globally aware than ever, and that can be both a blessing and a burden. We see so much suffering that it's easy to feel weary and helpless. The constant stream of bad news can make it seem like the world is falling apart.

But the good news is that it's not *our* job to hold the world together. That job already belongs to God. Part of ministry today is helping people lift their eyes from fear and fatigue to the firm hope that our Lord reigns.

Through All the Change


Yes, the world has changed. Even the way people think and relate has changed. But the heart of ministry hasn't: proclaiming Christ crucified and risen, shepherding God's people, seeking the lost, and holding out hope in a restless world.

As I look back on 25 years, I'm deeply grateful for every person I've served, every baptism and funeral, every confirmation class, every wedding, every visit and prayer. Most of all, I'm thankful for God's faithfulness. The Word still works. The Spirit still calls and gathers. And the love of Christ still binds His people together.

Thanks be to God, who never changes, even when everything else does.


