Remember Your Leaders

Hebrews 13:7-8 says, "Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

This is a call to remember leaders who have died and now are with the Lord in heaven- all the Christian leaders who have spoken the Word of God to us. It might be a pastor, a Sunday School teacher, a youth leader, or an elder. Remembering is not just recalling with fondness someone's personality, but to call to mind their faith and their way of life.

What do you remember about Pastor Bob's preaching and Bible teaching? I remember him taking these tasks very seriously. He preached the Law with sternness- convicting us our sins. After hearing the thunder of God's judgment we would wonder, "How could I ever be saved?" But then He would preach the Gospel with great sweetness. He pointed us to Jesus Christ who paid for every sin with His blood on the cross. He would always proclaim us to the risen Lord who won the victory over sin, death, and the devil. And after hearing that promise, we would conclude, "How could I <u>not</u> be saved with such a great Savior?!"

I also remember the many Bible studies, the new member classes, and confirmation classes that he taught. He would lead us deep into God's Word. Why? Because he wanted us to be well fed and nourished by the truth, and to be equipped as disciples in a world full of lies.

I hope you will remember how Pastor Bob labored in the Word. Because it was all for you! Leaders in the church are often criticized and belittled today. But the Bible teaches us to listen to them. "They are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account (Heb.13:7)."

Why do we remember our leaders? Because they pointed us to Christ. Why do we imitate their faith? Because their faith rested in the Savior who does not change. This is our anchor. Leaders may come and go. Beloved pastors may retire, die, or go elsewhere to serve. But the Lord they served is not gone.

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Amen.





Back to the Basics: Wisdom for a New School Year

September always carries with it a unique sense of beginning. The long days of summer slowly give way to cooler mornings, sharpened pencils, new backpacks, and fresh notebooks waiting to be filled. For families, this season often means juggling school schedules, sports practices, church activities, and the return of everyday routines. For students, it brings a mixture of excitement and nerves—the wonder of new opportunities combined with the challenge of new responsibilities.

In the midst of this busyness, it is important to pause and remember that education is not only about academics. Wisdom and learning are not just confined to the pages of textbooks or the walls of a classroom—they are rooted in God Himself. Scripture tells us in Proverbs 1:7: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction." This verse reminds us that true knowledge begins with a heart that reverences God. A new school year is not just about grades or achievements; it's an opportunity to grow in character, in faith, and in wisdom that lasts far beyond graduation.

This truth applies to every season of life. In other words, faith is not meant to be a Sunday-only subject. It is designed to shape every part of our daily routines—morning car rides, family dinners, bedtime prayers, and even conversations while waiting in the school pick-up line. Parents, grandparents, teachers, and mentors all have a role in helping the next generation see how God's truth speaks into every moment of life.

As we step into a new school year, perhaps God is inviting us to go "back to the basics." Not just the basics of reading, writing, and math, but the basics of faith—prayer, Scripture, and worship. Building our lives on these foundations helps us to face the year ahead with strength and hope. Jesus Himself is our sure foundation, and when we place Him at the center of our learning, our decisions, and our relationships, He promises to guide our steps.

So, what might this look like in practical terms? It could mean setting aside a few minutes each morning to pray with your child before school. It might mean memorizing a verse together as a family each week. It might be as simple as speaking words of encouragement to a teacher, a bus driver, or a classmate who needs kindness. These small habits of faith have a way of shaping hearts for a lifetime.

This September, let's pray not only for good grades, but for wisdom. Let's ask God to fill our classrooms with respect, compassion, and joy. Let's make our homes places of encouragement and prayer. And let's support our teachers, students, and families with love and patience as they navigate the year ahead. Above all, may this school year be marked by the presence of Christ—the true Teacher—who leads us into knowledge, wisdom, and life that never fades.

Heavenly Father,

We thank You for the gift of learning and for the new beginnings that this school year brings. Grant students a spirit of curiosity and diligence, teachers a heart of patience and wisdom, and parents the strength to guide with love and grace. Help us to keep Christ at the center of our homes, our classrooms, and our daily routines. May all we do bring honor to You, and may Your Word be the foundation on which we build.
