KIDS IN THE DIVINE SERVICE



Do Lutherans honor and remember the saints?

Yes. Remembering and honoring the saints is very "Lutheran." God's Word and the Lutheran Confessions teach that remembering and honoring the saints is a great thing to do.

Why is it such a great thing to do?

The Apology of the Augsburg Confession, which explains what Lutherans believe, teaches that we honor the saints for three reasons. ① Thanksgiving. When we honor the saints, we thank God for "showing (his people) examples of his mercy, revealing his will to save men, and giving teachers and other gifts to the church." ② Strengthening our faith. When we see how our Lord forgives the saints, we are "encouraged to believe that grace does abound more than sin." (Do you remember when Peter, one of the disciples, denied Jesus three times? Even the Apostles sinned and received forgiveness.) ③ "the imitation, first of their faith and then of their other virtues ..." We pray that God would keep us as strong in the faith as they were!



Parents: Explain to your children that we are not praying to the saints; we are simply honoring them on a special day in the Church Year. Remind them that, when we die, we will be with our Lord in heaven, which is where the saints are right now!

Building Faith at Home: Tips for Parents and Families

As parents and families, one of the greatest gifts we can give our children is a foundation of faith that begins at home. While church services, Sunday school, and youth groups are important, nurturing faith at home helps it flourish daily. Here are some practical ways you can integrate faith into your family's daily life, encouraging spiritual growth together.

1. Family Prayer Time

Setting aside time each day for family prayer creates space for reflection and connection with God. It can be as simple as a prayer before meals or bedtime, or you could establish a dedicated time for prayer in the morning or evening.

Tips for family prayer time:

- Make it routine: Consistency is key. Start with just a few minutes and build up as it becomes part of your family's rhythm.
- Include everyone: Let each family member take turns leading the prayer or sharing specific requests. This helps children feel involved and learn how to pray from their hearts.
- Use a prayer jar: Write down prayer requests on slips of paper and place them in a jar. Each day, pull one out and pray for that need together.

2. Read and Study the Bible Together

The Bible is the living Word of God, and reading it together as a family allows everyone to grow in their understanding of who God is and how He works in our lives. Family Bible study can be simple and age-appropriate, tailored to the needs of your family.

Ideas for family Bible study:

- Choose a family devotional: Many devotionals are written specifically for families, offering short, daily readings with questions or activities to spark discussion.
- Read a Bible story a week: For younger children, focus on one Bible story each week. Act it out, illustrate it, or discuss its meaning in everyday life.
- Talk about scripture in daily life: Find ways to weave scripture into conversations. For example, when facing a challenge, refer to a Bible verse that speaks to trust or hope in God.

3. Faith-Based Activities

Children often learn best through hands-on activities. Incorporating faith into creative or interactive projects can make it fun and memorable.

Faith activity ideas:

- Create a "Blessing Board": Use a bulletin board or whiteboard to write down blessings you notice each day. This helps cultivate gratitude and awareness of God's provision.
- Scripture scavenger hunt: Hide scripture verses around your house, and let the kids find them. Once they've found all the verses, read them together and talk about what they mean.
- Acts of service: As a family, serve others by volunteering at church or in your community. Discuss the biblical principles of love, compassion, and generosity that underpin your service.

4. Celebrate Faith Milestones

Just as we celebrate birthdays and achievements, celebrating spiritual milestones helps children recognize their growth in faith.

Milestone celebration ideas:

- Baptism anniversaries: Celebrate the date of your child's baptism with a special prayer, a family meal, or a meaningful gift, such as a devotional or faith-based book.
- First communion or confirmation: Mark these events with special recognition in the home, such as lighting a candle, writing a letter of encouragement, or having a family blessing ceremony.

5. Model Faith in Action

Perhaps the most powerful way to build faith at home is through the example you set. When children see their parents living out their faith—through prayer, service, forgiveness, and love—they learn how to integrate faith into their own lives.

Modeling tips:

- Be open about your faith journey: Share your own experiences, including moments of doubt or struggle, and how God has guided you through them.
- Worship together: Attend church services as a family and discuss the sermon or scripture afterward. This can help children connect what they hear at church with their lives at home.
- Show grace and forgiveness: In moments of conflict or frustration, model Christlike behavior by offering forgiveness and love, even when it's hard.

By creating an environment where faith is lived out every day, we plant seeds that will grow throughout our children's lives. Remember, it's not about being perfect—it's about being intentional. As we make space for God in our homes, we create opportunities for the whole family to grow in faith together.

The Davenport Zone Fall rally was held at Park View Lutheran Church, Eldridge, on Saturday, September 28, 2024.

It began at 8:30 AM with registration, ingathering, and a delicious brunch prepared by our WRO and other PVLC members, and served in the Fellowship Hall.

Afterwards we gathered in the Sanctuary. Bethany Dorschner gave accompaniment on guitar for the opening and closing hymns. Pastor Peter Hoft led the Bible study with 'Being a citizen of Heaven as well as a citizen of the United States.' We read passages that helped distinguish our own roles as Christians with dual citizenship in both kingdoms and discussed our responsibilities in each kingdom to proclaim God's truth. Philippians 3:20 "But our citizenship is in Heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ." ESV

The Davenport Circuit LWML business meeting, and the installation of officers followed. The Business meeting was led by Lois Kundel, Davenport Zone President, and began with the LWML pledge and Mission statement. Lois shared Kay Berry's secretary report. Loretta Wuerdeman shared the treasurer's report. Our local LWML has a balance of \$2,127.

A motion was made, seconded to take 10% (\$212.70) to the East Side Mission as a one-time offering. The motion was passed unanimously. Lois announced Scholarships for this year totaling \$15,000 being half awarded to 4 seminary students and half to 5 undergraduate students being split per student. Additional Scholarship money from the endowment funds to be split between all 9 students. Motion was made, seconded, to take \$300 to District mites, designated to LWML IED. It was passed unanimously.

YWR report was given by Cherise Valdez about her time at the last District Convention in Cedar Rapids as a first time YWR. The Nomination Committee consists of Holy Cross and Risen Christ churches. Installation of officers: Cherise Valdez as Secretary, Loretta Wuerdeman as Treasurer, and Pastor Hoft as the Pastoral Counselor.
